Global Campus and Polytechnic collaborate each year in offering a course to faculty who are interested in effective online teaching techniques. Applications for the course are due by March 31 and can be sent to Ashley Noll (ashley04@ksu.edu). Applications must be approved by the faculty members' department head. Cohort participants will be announced by April 22, 2016. Lisa Craft, K-State Polytechnic, is the instructor of the course and the participants always comment positively on the quality of the instruction and the techniques they learn. It requires 3 days face to face (June 7, 8, 9) and the rest of the sessions are fully online.

He is eager to understand ways in which the changing demographic landscape is shaping future opportunities, and how investments in people, places, and buildings can enable communities to evolve and achieve their potential as economically thriving and livable places.

Welcome to Kanopy!

I recently learned about the availability of a video service database through K-State Libraries that will be beneficial to the disciplines of APDesign.

According to the K-State Libraries' database webpage, "Kanopy is an on-demand streaming video service for educational institutions that provides access to more than 26,000 films. Kanopy works directly with filmmakers and film distribution companies to offer award-winning collections including titles from PBS, BBC, Criterion Collection, Media Education Foundation and more."

My search for possible videos turned up the following results: Architecture - 358 videos; Design - 265 videos; and Environmental Sciences - 918 videos.

A small sampling of titles include: Sand Wars; The practice of architecture: visiting Peter Zumthor; Science of structure: forces in balance; Tiny: a story about living small; Frederick Law Olmsted: designing America and Every speed: the meaning of movement.

I hope this new streaming video service will be useful to instructors as well as students as another resource for your instruction, education and research.
